Partnering for Impact – Consortial Publications



1. Who are community partners?

Community partners are individuals and organizations that are community based and community placed. They typically represent, or have strong ties to, the community being engaged. Academic community engaged researchers are not considered community partners for RADx-UP.

2. Why do I need to think about community partners when writing a RADx-UP analysis proposal?

RADx-UP research products have a higher likelihood of informing program, practice, and policy if they are designed and framed to address stated priorities, needs, and knowledge gaps of community partners.

3. Does this mean I will need to include a community partner in my analysis proposal?

Yes, RADx-UP encourages inclusion of at least 1 community partner as a member of the writing team. See [Publications Policy](#) and [Data Sharing Policy](#) for additional guidance on community partner involvement.

4. Why do I have to complete both a Concept and Analysis Proposal form?

The [Analysis Concept](#) question provides the opportunity for transparency of the idea and brings visibility of the idea to the consortium. By posting the Analysis Concept in [myRADx-UPhome](#) for at least two weeks, we will afford the opportunity for shared support and writing opportunities to projects and community members. The subsequent Analysis Proposal form will provide our statisticians guidance in what datasets will be helpful for your analysis.

5. What support will the CDCC provide during the proposal and writing process?

The CDCC will provide the following support during the process and welcome feedback from you:

- Project Leader assigned to your manuscript
- Zoom Links to facilitate collaboration and dedicated meeting times
- Box Folder with links for writing work
- Support during call to identify barriers and work to make connections with members of CDCC team as appropriate
- Statistician for consultation, for dataset pulls, and if needed, data analysis
- Workshop offerings
- Office Hours to meet with CDCC members as needed

6. Where can I access the RADx-UP data dashboards?

To view the data dashboard, go to [myRADx-UPhome](#), login, go to Reports tab, and select RADx-UP Data Dashboard. To view the Area-Level Data Linkage map, go to [myRADx-UPhome](#), login, go to Reports tab, and select RADx-UP Area-Level Data Linkage.

7. Where will concepts be posted?

Because concepts are being generated quickly, the CDCC will provide updates to the consortium on a weekly basis. The CDCC will also have concepts posted on [myRADx-UPhome](#).
